Fr Nathan: Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life.

Fr Nathan: As we humbly present to you these sacrificial offerings, O Lord, for the salvation of your servant Diana, we beseech your mercy, that she, who did not doubt your Son to be a loving Saviour, may find in her a merciful Judge.

ALL: Amen.

Eucharistic Frayer Fr Nathan: The Lord be with you.

ALL: And with your spirit. Fr Nathan: Lift up your hearts.

ALL: We lift them up to the Lord.

Fr Nathan: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

ALL: It is right and just.

Fr Nathan: It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Christ our Lord.

For he is the salvation of the world, the life of the human race, the resurrection of the dead. Through him the host of Angels adores your majesty and rejoices in your presence for ever. May our voices, we pray, join with theirs in one chorus of exultant praise, as we acclaim:

ALL: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Fr Nathan: You are indeed Holy, O Lord, the fount of all holiness. Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall, so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion, he took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body,

which will be given up for you.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice and, once more giving thanks, he gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take this, all of you, and drink from it,

for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this in memory of me. The mystery of faith.

ALL: We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

Fr Nathan: Therefore, as we celebrate the memorial of his
Death and Resurrection, we offer you, Lord, the Bread of life and the Chalice of
salvation, giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and
minister to you. Humbly we pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ,
we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit.

Remember, Lord, your Church, spread throughout the world, and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with Francis our Pope, Shane our Bishop and all the clergy.

Remember your servant Diana, whom you have called today from this world to yourself. Grant that she who was united with your Son in a death like his, may also be one with him in his Resurrection.

Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your welcome them into the light of your face.

Have mercy on us all, we pray, that with the Blessed Virgin,

Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her Spouse,
with the blessed Apostles, and all the Saints

who have pleased you throughout the ages, we may merit to be coheirs to eternal life, and may praise and glorify you through your Son, Jesus Christ.

Fr Nathan: Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

ALL: Amen.

The Communion Rite

Fr Nathan: At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

ALL: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
